Dear Members:

It is my pleasure to present this third Annual Report for the Bell Barn Society of Indian Head. The Society was formed on August 29, 2006 in response to a need to find a way to preserve the historic round stone barn erected in 1882 on the Bell Farm just north of Indian Head.

Since that date, a number of initiatives were undertaken. These focused on two primary objectives – [1] to rebuild the Bell Barn on public property, and [2] to interpret the history of the Bell Farm and this unique structure.

This report outlines what has transpired during 2009, and speaks to the work that remains to be achieved in order to reach our objective. I am pleased to report that many of our short and long-term goals have now been met as we focus on the Grand Opening on July 24<sup>th</sup>.

A major change in the Project in 2009 was the decision to build a separate Washroom-Maintenance Building, instead of incorporating those features within the Barn, where adequate space for those simply did not exist. The overall design of that building will look similar to one of the original Bell Farm Cottages. However, as a result of that decision, plus increased construction and interpretation development costs, the projected cost of the overall project rose by 37% to \$ 1.5 million. Consequently, and in spite of major federal and provincial government commitments, our fundraising activities will have to be pursued with renewed vigour throughout 2010, and possibly beyond.

It continues to be a pleasure to serve as the Society’s Chairperson, and I look forward to seeing the Bell Barn reconstruction completed in 2010.

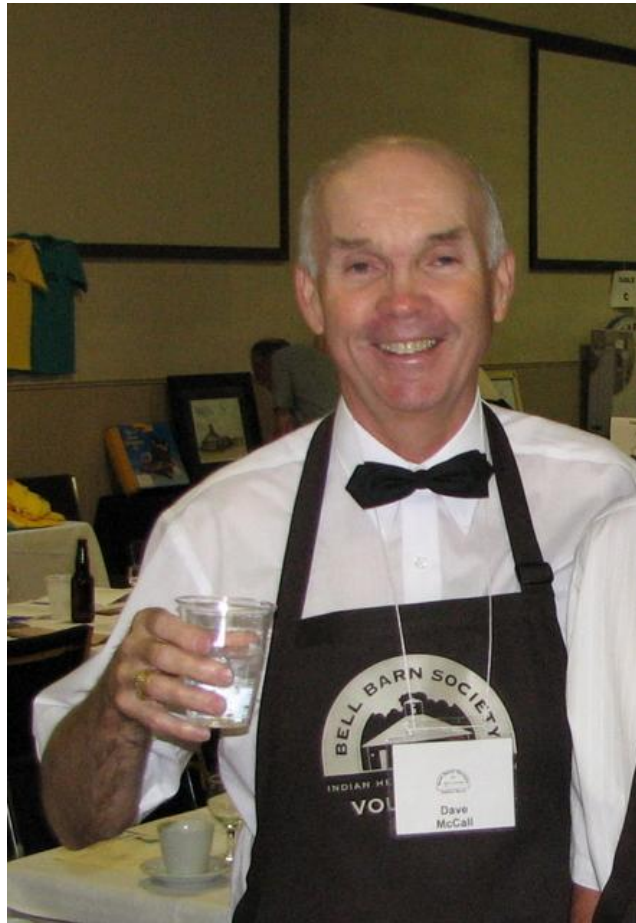

## **Dave McCall: 1941-2009**

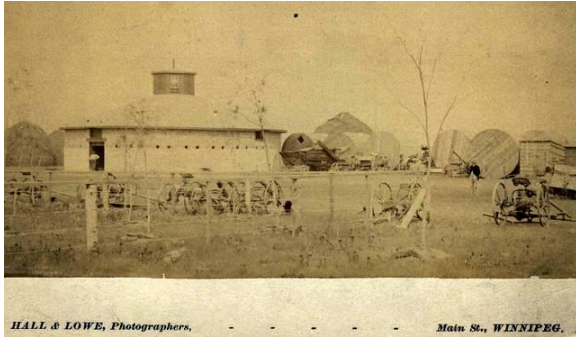

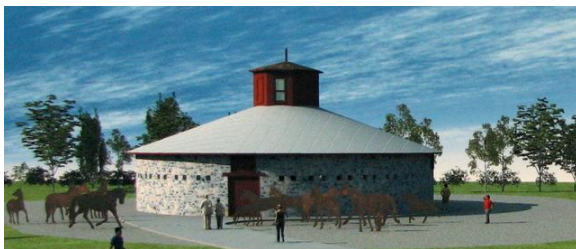
## Project Overview

### Background:

The Bell Barn has been a Saskatchewan landmark from the day it was completed in 1882, but by 2006 was in a state of ruin, beyond repair. In order to preserve this important agricultural icon, it was determined that the structurally unsound remaining components had to be dismantled and reconstructed. It was therefore decided to reconstruct the barn on another part of the original farmyard, incorporating new material where necessary, but following as closely as possible the original historic design.

### Proposed Interpretation:

The Bell Farm is unusual as it is associated with a number of important people and events in the history of Saskatchewan. The following six stories have been identified for possible interpretation. When the Barn opens in 2010, we will initially focus on the first four:

- Story 1 – Major W.R. Bell and the Bell Farm from 1882 to 1896
- Story 2 – Impact of the Bell Farm on Farming in Western Canada
- Story 3 – State of the Art Telecommunications at the Bell Farm
- Story 4 – Reconstruction of the Bell Barn
- Story 5 – Unique Town Planning
- Story 6 – Innovative Construction

### Highlights of Activities Undertaken in 2006, 2007 and 2008:

- Created the Bell Barn Society of Indian Head as a Non-Profit Organization
- Appointed Hon. Dr. Lynda Haverstock as Honorary Patron, and Eric Peterson as Honorary Chairman
- Developed a fundraising program that raised over \$200,000 from individuals, small businesses and corporations
- Dismantled the Bell Barn ruins and salvaged all of the stone and some of the wooden parts
- Landscaped the new site, installed the new barn foundation, and planted a shelterbelt
- The Bell family donated the original Bell Farm Visitors' Register and other historic documents

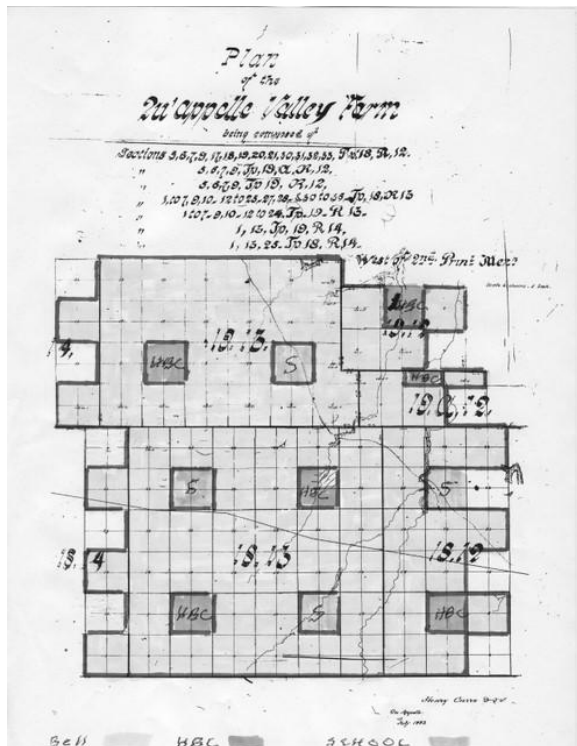

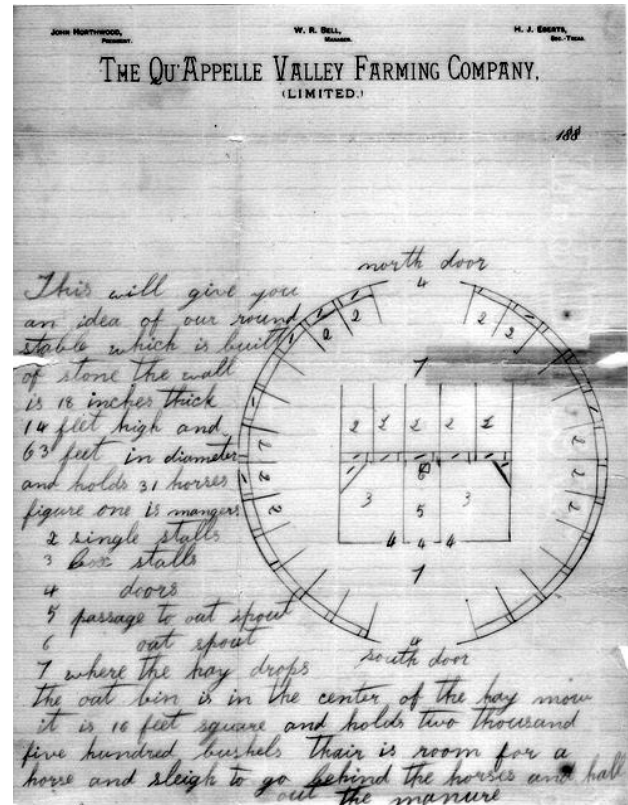

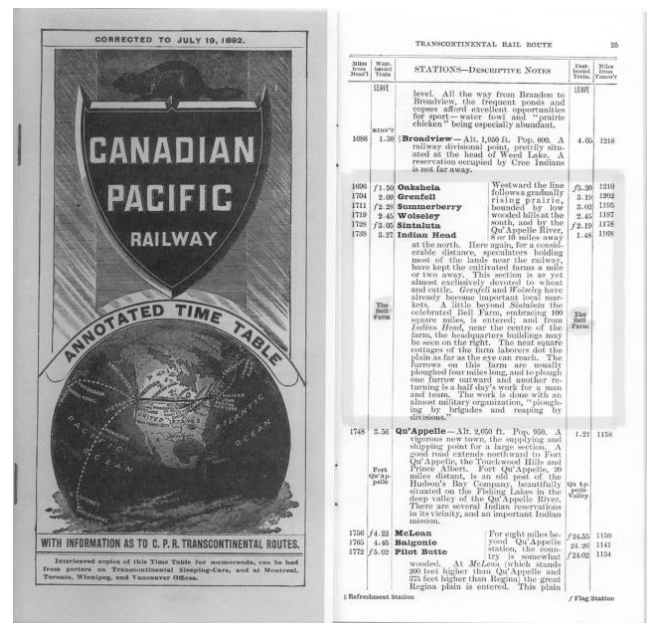
- Complete reconstruction of the Bell Barn



**1. Accounting policies**

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. By their nature, these estimates are subject to measurement uncertainty and the effect on the financial statements of changes in such estimates in future periods could be significant.

The charity's financial instruments consist of cash and cash equivalents. It is management's opinion that the charity is not exposed to significant interest, currency or credit risks arising from these financial instruments as their fair values approximate their carrying value.

**2. Ownership of Bell Barn**

The Bell Barn site and all structures located thereon are owned by the Town of Indian Head.

**3. Cash flow statement**

A cash flow statement has not been presented with this report as it does not add meaningful information to the financial statement.

**4. Incorporation statute**

Bell Barn Society of Indian Head Inc. is a registered charity incorporated under the Non-Profit Corporations Act of Saskatchewan and is not subject to income tax pursuant to Subsection 149(1) of the Income Tax Act.
